- Access to Parenting Supports, Individual and Family Counselling

WHO DO WE HELP?

We help single mothers (19+) facing multiple barriers such as unstable housing, a precarious financial situation, and limited or no access to education, childcare, and sustainable employment.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- 19 years or older
- Experiencing the effects of poverty
- Resident of Peterborough City or County
- Canadian citizen, landed immigrant, or convention refugee
- Child(ren) are under 17 years old and at least one child living with the mother
- High school diploma (preferred)
- Capable of reaching college level academics within 6-8 months
- On or eligible for OW, ODSP or EI
- No unresolved OSAP debt
- No current criminal proceedings or substance abuse (minimum 1 year)
- Able to commit to participating in a full-time program

PROGRAM PARTICIPATION:

The Program has 4 Phases, each of which must be completed before moving to the next phase.

Phase 1: Skills Training & Academic Upgrading

Training in life-skills, computer and financial literacy, employability skills, networking opportunities and academic upgrading for college entrance.

Phase 2: Community College

A 2-year diploma granting program at Fleming College, in a discipline that is geared towards meeting current demand in the labour market. Homeward Bound Peterborough encourages study in skilled-trades and non-traditional occupations for women.

Phase 3: Employment Skills

A 12-week program to enhance employability through not only hard skills that they need, but soft skills that will allow them to be successful in the workplace.

Phase 4: Internship, Employment & Exit

14-week unpaid Internship
Homeward Bound connects women to opportunities for full-time employment and supports them to transition into their new lives.

KEY SUPPORTS:

Housing: Homeward Bound participants live in furnished apartments until they graduate and find permanent employment (to a maximum of 4 years).

On-site Child Care and Support for Children: High quality, certified childcare with is offered on-site for young children.

Case Management:

Each participant receives guidance, counselling, support and will develop regular Action Plans throughout the 4 Phases. Support continues to be available to graduates and their children after the program ends.
